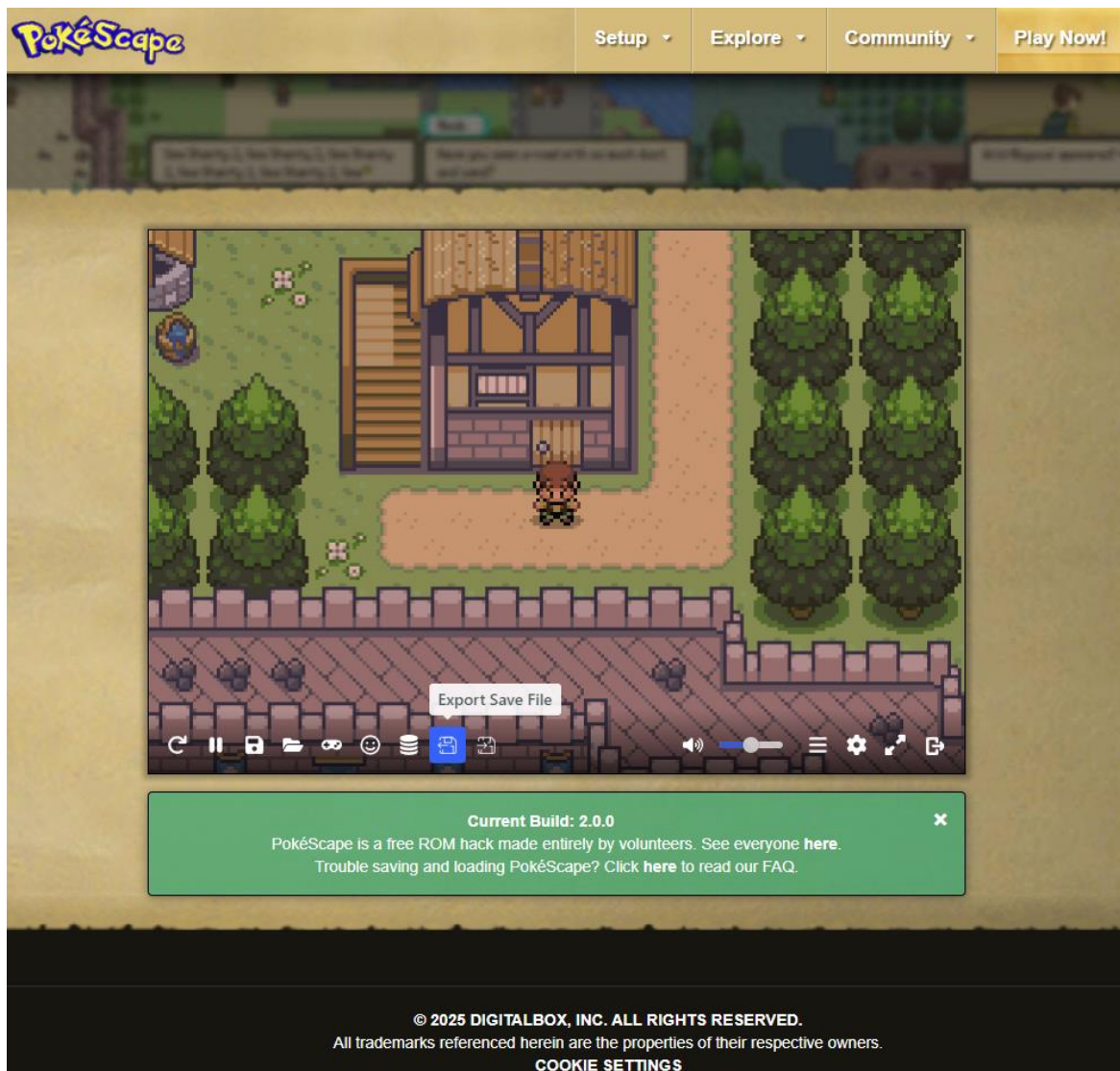


PokéScape save to mGBA

- 1) First, export your PokéScape save file.



2) Convert your save file. This converter works:

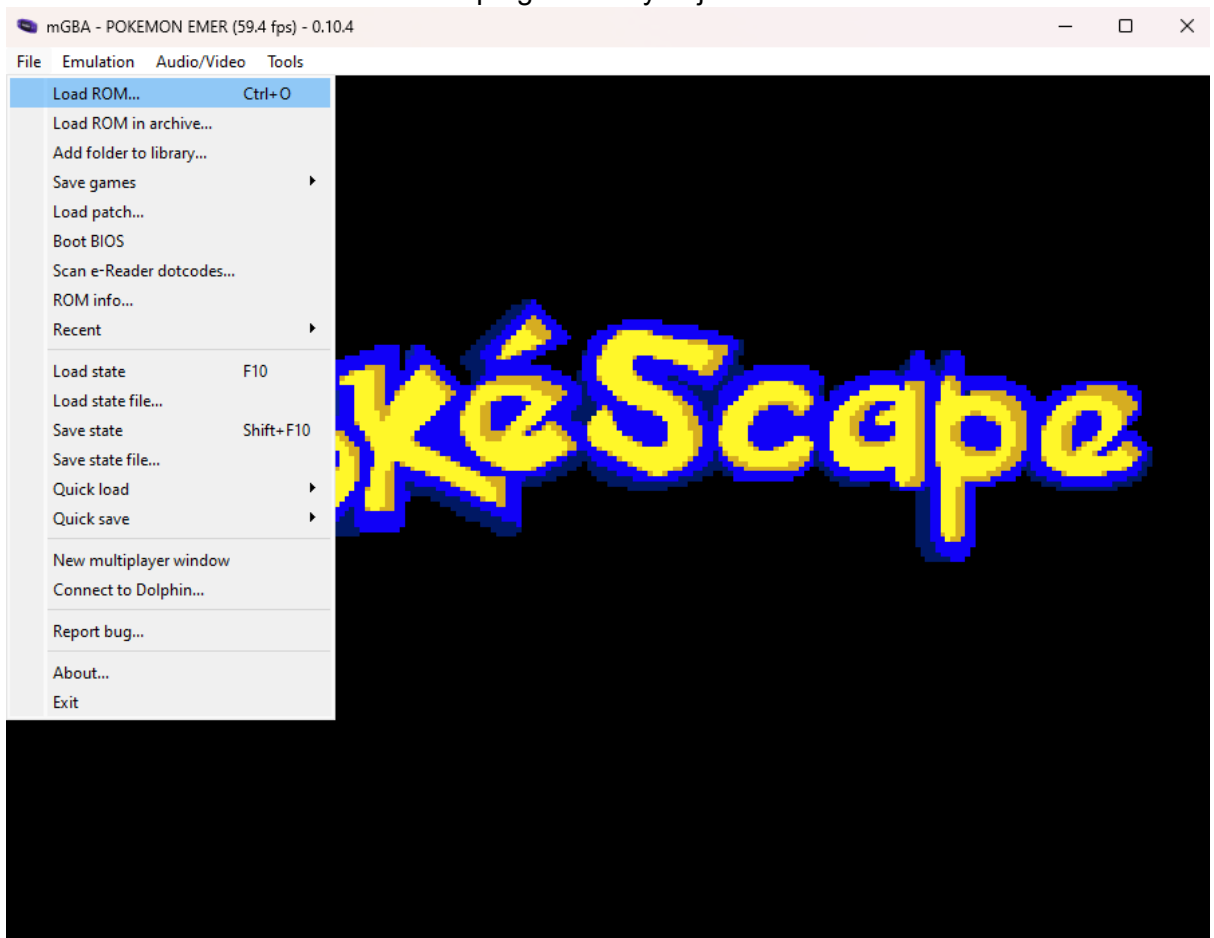

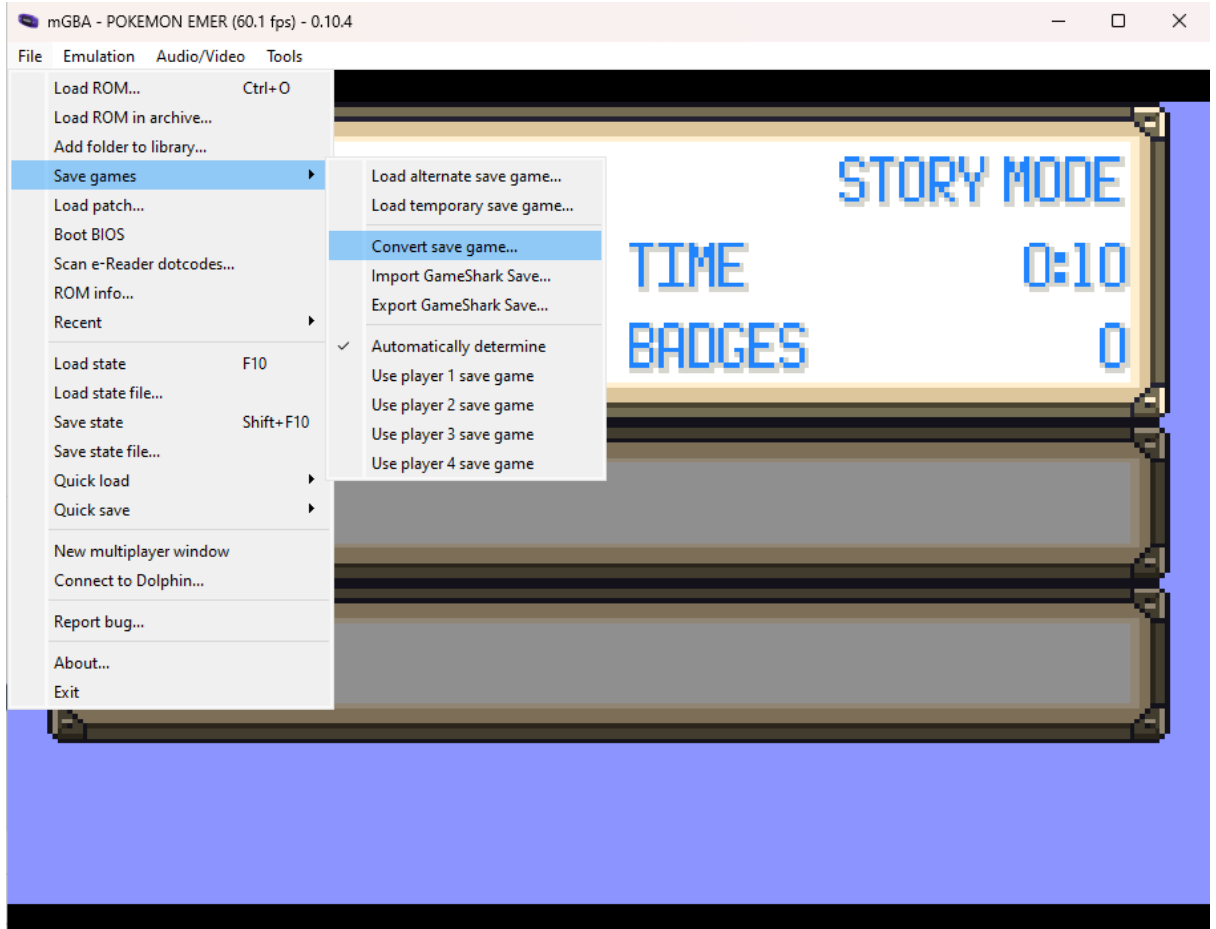

Make sure you are converting FROM an “Emulator/Raw” file. It should look like the above. You will need to have the “PokéScape.gba” file downloaded. You can do that here: <https://digitalbox.co.uk/PS/legacy.php>

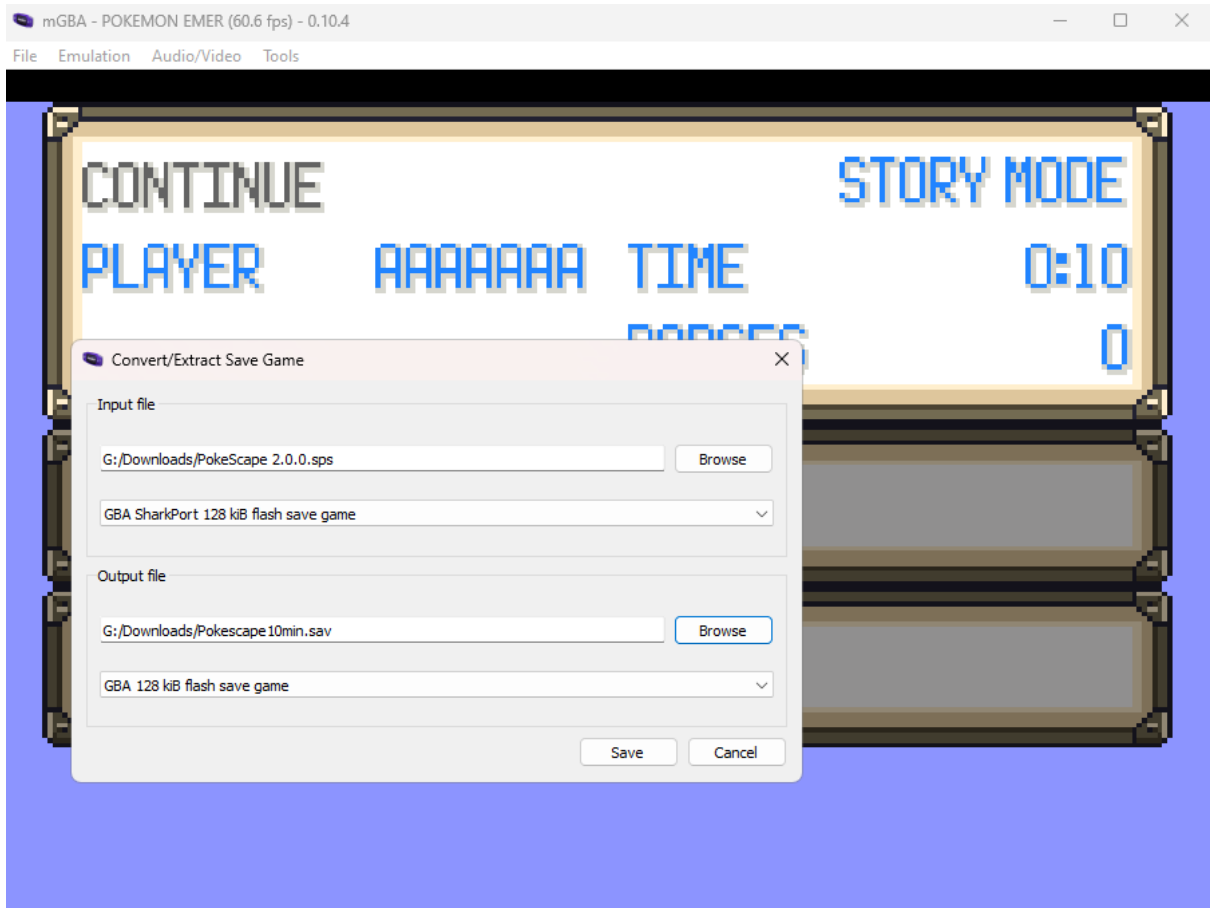
3) Go to mGBA and load the “PokéScape.gba” rom you just downloaded.



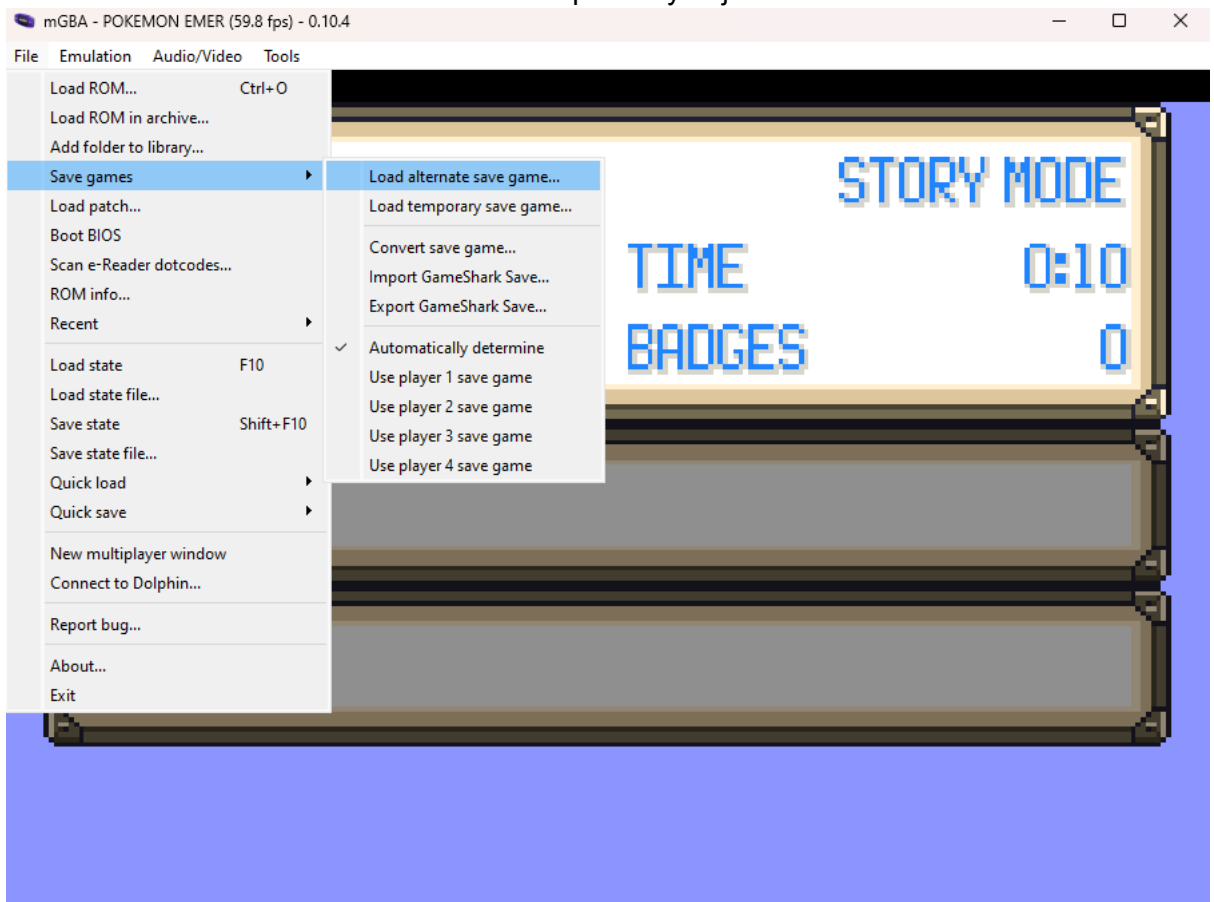
4) Convert the save to mGBA format.

5) Load an “Alternate Save” and select the output file you just created.



Your save should now be present on the mGBA emulator.

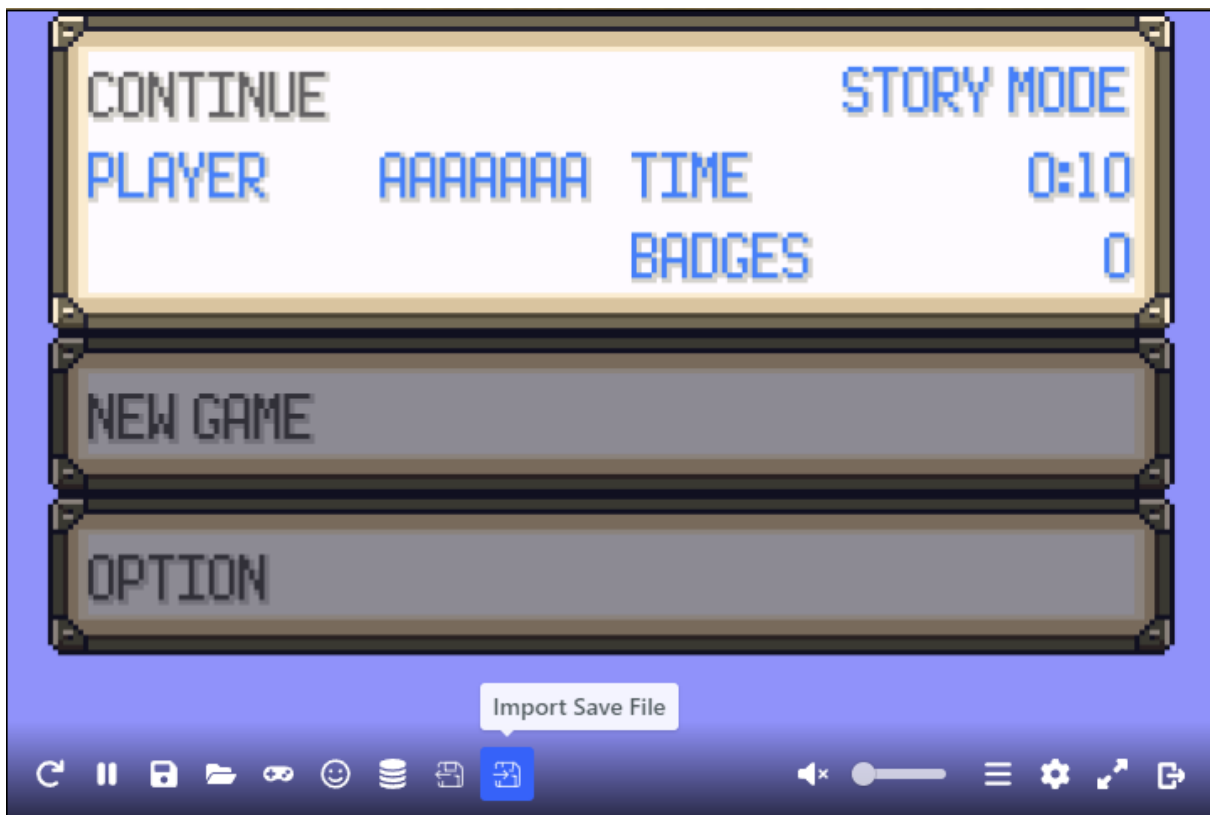
*This hasn't been tested and game breaking bugs may appear.

4) Restart the browsers emulator by clicking "Restart".
